WHAT IS DCHS?

DCHS is a public alternative high school for students from Davidson County. It houses students from all across the county, many of whom have extenuating circumstances that have hindered their education in a traditional school environment.

It is designed for students who learn more effectively in a small classroom setting. Classroom instruction is delivered by highly qualified teachers, web-based curriculum or a combination of both (blended learning).



CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized through North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS), Haiku Learning online courseware, and face to face instruction. Three (3) credits per semester is the minimum course load; students take three 100 minute classes broken up into 50 minutes of face to face instruction and 50 minutes of online instruction and are in labs to receive additional help from literacy coaches or teachers on their course work.

Students are also able to receive college credit by enrolling into classes through College and Career Promise at Davidson Community College.



ENROLLMENT PROCESS

Students are referred by:

-School counselors at their current school.

-Parent/Guardian

-Self

Application

Once DCHS receives a student referral the student and parent/guardian is asked to fill out an application for admission.

Which includes a school counselor/principal recommendation from current school.

Interview

After DCHS receives the student's application, an interview is setup between the student, parent/guardian, school counselor, and/or principal. Our enrollment team then reviews all student materials and makes a decision for enrollment.
